Of all the contributions America has made to the history of the world, the idea of freedom from a social hierarchy has been the greatest. [...] To this day it's still the most powerful, compelling ideal holding the whole nation together. And yet, although Jefferson called this doctrine of social equality 'self-evident,' it is not at all self-evident. Scientific evidence and the social evidence of history indicate the opposite is self-evident. There is no 'self-evidence' in European history that all men are created equal. There's no nation in Europe that doesn't trace its history to a time when it was 'self-evident' that all men are created unequal. Jean Jacques Rousseau, who is sometimes given credit for this doctrine, certainly didn't get it from the history of Europe or Asia or Africa. He got it from the impact of the New World upon Europe and from contemplation of one particular kind of individual who lived in the New World, the person he called the 'Noble Savage'. The idea that 'all men are created equal' is a gift to the world from the American Indian.

As children belong to the world, and not to their parents who raise them up, so Humanity belongs to the Universe, and not to Earth, that raised it.






Destructivity - David Brin "Earth"

Whoever observed a cat playing with a mouse - or a stallion fighting for predominance - knows that human beings are very destructive not because something fundamentally wrong exist in our nature. It is our power that increases the damages that we do, up to threaten the planet itself. [...] The irony of such myths of the wild noble, or of the noble animal, is that they are sustained with greatest conviction quite by the vitiated western people, whose comfortable culture was the first to feel so peaceful to promote a new tradition of self-criticism.
